## *Transfer Guide for students pursuing Associate in Arts Classics Major*

The following guide and sample degree completion plan outlines 2 years at Carl Sandburg College to receive an Associate in Arts degree and 2 years at Monmouth College to complete the Bachelor of Arts degree in Classics. This guide was built to help transfer students prepare for their transition to Monmouth College, and schedules may be adjusted when working with an advisor.

Note that up to 64 credit hours (equivalent to 16.00 Monmouth College course credits) may be transferred to Monmouth College. Courses with a C or better may be transferred. Additional courses earned in the completion of the Associates Degree will be applied toward the overall credit required for the Bachelor of Arts degree (32 credits).

Students must complete a minimum of 16 course credits during the junior and senior year at Monmouth College for a total of 32 course credits to be awarded the Bachelor of Arts degree. No more than 13 course credits may be taken in a single discipline (CLAS). No more than 16 course credits may be taken in a single department (CLAS/LATN/GREK). Students may take additional CLAS courses provided the maximum limits are not exceeded.

Only grades of C- or better may be applied to the major. Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA in major and a minimum 2.0 overall cumulative GPA for the degree.

The below is a sample schedule for the junior and senior years at Monmouth. The sequence of these courses may vary, and the department will work closely with students to complete major requirements on time.

Students must take 8 credits in LATN, GREK, and CLAS courses to earn the Classics major. Required courses are CLAS 200, CLAS 201/301, CLAS 235/335, and CLAS 195. Classics majors must also complete LATN 101-102, GREK 101-102, or their equivalent preparation.

Additional required credits should be taken from the range of CLAS, LATN, and/or GREK courses that the department offers, or courses cross-listed with them from other departments, including HIST, PHIL, and THEA. Students should consult with Classics faculty to choose courses that best serve their purpose.
