## Notice of Immunity Requirements

Illinois state requires students who enroll at a post-secondary educational institution present a copy of proof of immunity evidencing the following immunizations:

## **State Requirements:**

Vaccine	Dosage	Required Intervals Between Doses
Diphtheria , Tetanus, Pertussis (3 or more doses)	Students shall provide dates of any combination of three or more doses of Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis containing vaccine. One dose must be Tdap vaccine. The last dose of vaccine (DTP, DTaP, DT, Td, or Tdap) must have been received within 10 years prior to the term of current enrollment.	The minimum time interval between the first and second dose must have been at least four weeks (28 days), with the third dose having been received at least six months after the second or last dose of the basic series.
Measles (2 doses)	Students shall provide documentation of receipt of two doses of live measles virus vaccine on or after the first birthday.  Students who cannot provide proof of immunization may provide laboratory (serologic) evidence of measles immunity.	The minimum time interval between each dose must have been at least four weeks (28 days). If either dose was received prior to 1968, proof must be provided that a live virus vaccine, without gamma globulin, was administered.
Rubella (2 doses)	Students shall provide documentation of receipt of two doses of live rubella virus vaccine on or after the first birthday.  Students who cannot provide proof of immunization may provide laboratory (serologic) evidence of rubella immunity.	The minimum time interval between each dose must have been at least four weeks (28 days).
Mumps (2 doses)	Students shall provide documentation of receipt of two doses of live mumps virus vaccine on or after the first birthday.  Students who cannot provide proof of immunization may provide laboratory (serologic) evidence of mumps immunity.	The minimum time interval between each dose must have been at least four weeks (28 days).
Meningococcal Conjugate (MCV4) (1 dose)	At least one dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine	On or after 16 years of age

- Complete the <u>Immunization Form</u>. All dates and doctor's signatures **must be** valid.
- ➤ Illinois students may submit their school health form "Certificate of Child Health Examination" (all immunizations listed above MUST be listed.)
- For measles, mumps and rubella vaccines only, in lieu of proof of immunity as defined in this Part, evidence of birth on or before January 1, 1957, such as a birth certificate, driver's license, or personal identification card issued by the Secretary of State.
- A student who enrolls at a post-secondary educational institution without providing proof of immunity shall be precluded from enrolling at that institution in a subsequent term unless the student provides proof of immunity acceptable to the designated recordkeeping office or is granted a medical or religious exemption by the institution.
